

Rose Garden Plaque

Application for the exclusive right to display a Rose Plaque in the Old/New/Millennium Cemetery for a three year period



LIMITED AVAILABILITY - please check with Cemetery Office

Conditions

- 1 The Rose Garden Plaque reference number is on the plan held at the Cemeteries Office and once the position is agreed, it may not be altered
- 2 The three year period begins on the date the Rose Garden Plaque is placed on display within your chosen cemetery
- 3 All work in connection with the Rose Garden Plaque will be undertaken by the Council or their nominated agent
- 4 The plaque inscription is to be approved by the Council, who reserve the right to disallow if, in their opinion, it is libellous or likely to cause offence to any person or body of persons
- 5 At the end of the appropriate period an option to renew will be given. Should renewal not be required within one month of the expiry date, the right of display will come to an end. The Council will remove and the position will become re-available
- 6 Removed plaques will be offered to the applicant, if accepted they must be collected within 90 days, after that time the Council will have the automatic right of disposal
- 7 Two small plastic vases only can be placed at the base of the rose. No other memorabilia is allowed.


